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

The town of Valencia de Don Juan, on the southern part of the province of León, is the starting point of this trail. The town's origins date back to a Vaccaei settlement established where the castle ruins are today. This municipality, also known as Coyanza, was given its current name after the First Duke of the Villa, Prince John, son of King Alfonso X.

Guide to the Nature Trails

NORTHWESTERN PENINSULAR

- de las Mulas and turn off at the first track to your right, past the Valjunco urban development. The first section of the trail runs along a concrete path to the east of the houses, among Poplar groves and agricultural fields, heading toward Valencia de Don Juan and crossing several roads, further to which it goes straight on toward To reach the trailhead of this nature trail, you need to the South. take road LE-512 at Valencia de Don Juan up to Mansilla
- an intersection with the road near the sports centre, the path is no longer paved but covered with gravel. From this point onward, it runs among thorn trees (*Acacia* sp.), elm trees (*Ulmus* sp.), walnut trees (*Ilaglans regia*), airborne plane-trees (*Platanus hispanica*) and cropped lands where corn and sunflowers are grown.
- The trail continues straight on, closer to the road to Castrofuerte, crossing two bridges over small brooks and several agricultural trails.

9 Several agricultural paths run through our trail, which continues straight on until it reaches Castrofuerte. A road runs through this town and there is a small fountain nearby. A few metres away from there you can find the train station, now in ruins, where the trail ends. The trail goes on surrounded by agricultural fields up to kilometre point 9, from which it is paved again. From this point, surrounded by new cropped lands, you can get a glimpse at the town of Castrofuerte.
