This section starts at the town of Siete Aguas, whose name, which stands for "Seven Waters" in Spanish, reflects the fact that this area is dotted with many water springs. After leaving behind the Hoya de Buñol-Chiva County, the remaining route crosses the Requena-Utiel County. The vineyards, and, together with the Aleppo pine woods and the River Magro river shores, are of sufficient interest to start this adventure. 
