

SECTOR SOUTHERN PENINSULAR NATURE TRAIL ACEITE GREENWAY. MORILES TO CAMPO REAL

This route starts at the municipal boundary of Lucena, immediately after Subbética Greenway Nature Trail. The trail head may be reached by a dirt road, near a few buildings, at kilometre 29.2 of A-318. The dirt road soon leaves the Subbética Greenway Nature Trail on the right, and starts this nature trail on the left.

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
- Throughout the whole journey, you will walk on a superficially paved road. Olive plantations (*Olea europaea*), stretching to the horizon, asparagus (*Asparagus acutifolius*) and herbaceous ruderals (the plants that typically grow on ditches and at the borders of paths) will accompany this journey, dotted with the occasional appearance of some large holm oaks (*Quercus ilex*). There are also fig trees (*Ficus carica*), vineyards (*Vitis vinifera*) and quinces (*Cydonia oblonga*) grown in vegetable gardens near the edges of the road, as well as rushes (*Juncus* sp.) along the banks of brooks.
- **2.** Shortly after the trail begins, it crosses over the Fuente Romero brook and, soon after, it reaches a rest area.
- 3. At this point the trail meets the A-318 road, which is crossed via a footbridge.
- 4. Throughout the route, rabbits (Oryctolagus cuniculus), whose warrens are built along the railway embankments, will run across the path, where there are also red partridges (Alectoris rufa), black kites (Milvus migrans) or Mongagu's harrier (Circus pygargus). The contast hum of the cicadas is a typical sound you will hear if you take this route in summer.



We invite you to visit them and offer you the keys to enjoy the trip. In this brochure you will find a brief description of the Aceite Greenway. Moriles to Campo Real Nature Trail and the map for the journey, along with recommendations to make the most of this experience. We only ask one thing of you: do not forget to leave everything as you found it. The conservation of these pathways is also your responsibility.

- Looking always ahead towards the Castillo and Niño mountain ranges, the trail continues close to various farmhouses and wineries. After crossing the Navaluenga brook, when the level of water so allows, you will reach soon the end of the route, next to the Campo Real railway stop.
- 6. When the railway was fully operational, the section between Puente Genil and Campo Real was part of the Cordoba-Malaga railway line, and the Campo Real station was located between the two tracks. Since the closure of this section, the Campo Real Station is no longer operational and has been downgraded to a halt.

THE OIL TRAIN

This railway line was originally built for mining purposes, aiming to transport lead from the county of Linares to the port of Malaga via Jaen, which at the moment of the works concession did not have rail service.

The activity declined, leading to the closure of some actions. A Madrid-Malaga omnibus service via Jaen operated until 1983, but this service was halted in 1984 when it was replaced by a regular bus service.



PUENTE GENIL

ne Campo Real train station, final destination of this retch of the nature trail, belongs to the Cordovan mucipality of Puente Genil. It is part of the 'Campiña Sur prodobesa', bordering the province of Seville. Located a privileged geographical enclave, in the very heart of idalusia, it is the ideal location as for railway and road mmunications, for it is within a short distance of the sost important Andalusian capital cities (Córdoba 69 n, Málaga 110 km, Seville 120 km and Granada 150 km).

ne foundational origins of this town go back to the Iministrative and demographic union between the Iage called "Pontón de Don Gonzalo" (founded in the ys of King Fernando III by the II Lord of the State of guilar, Mr. Gonzalo Yañez Dovinhal II, and located in e right – or Cordovan – bank of the Genil river), and e small population centre of Miragenil, located in the posite bank and belonging administratively to the ovince of Seville.

Thus, said union between villages took place during the egency of María Cristina (by Royal Decree, on 10th Derember, 1834), leading to the current name of Puente Genil, which makes obvious reference to the physical means that allowed said integration: the bridge (puente n Spanish) that crosses the course of the Genil river



boundaries of Moriles and Lucena and Campo Real Station, provides continuity to the Aceite Greenway and the Subbética, the former in Jaen and the latter in Cordoba. The greenway follows the now-defunct Puente Genil-Linares railway line, which had greatly contributed to the development and industrialisation of the towns through which it passed. While it was originally built for mining interests, it was used mainly for transporting olive oil, hence its popular name "Oil Train".
