General objectives

- High levels of competence and awareness of EU rules amongst official control staff
- Ensure more uniform, objective and efficient controls throughout the EU
- High levels of consumer protection, animal health and welfare and plant health
- Level playing field for food businesses





Specific aims in non-EU countries

- Help non-EU countries to better understand and meet more easily EU rules/standards
- Reduce rejections at EU borders and facilitate access to the EU market
- Ensure fair trade with non-EU countries, particularly developing countries
- Contribute to safer food for non-EU country consumers and a more diverse range of safe food products in the EU
- Enhance SPS regulatory cooperation with non-EU countries





Characteristics of training

- Training is organised by external contractors
- Training types
 - Traditional face-to-face workshops
 - Secondment of individual experts (Sustained training missions)
- Basic principles
 - To favour knowledge/experience sharing and networking
 - To follow a train-the-trainer approach





BTSF in figures from 2006 to 2013

Around 960 events More than 41.000 participants Budget of approx. € 98 million





Training 2014

Around 160 events 30 activities approx. Around 6200 participants Budget of almost €15 million





Prevention/Control/Eradication of TSEs

- Organised under BTSF at first in 2008
- More than 15 events involving approximately 500 participants
- Main focus on:
 - Control of the feed ban
 - Control of removal of Specified Risk Material
 - Monitoring and surveillance programmes
 - TSEs in small ruminants (e.g. breeding programmes)





Prevention/Control/Eradication of TSEs

- 8 three-day courses
 - 2014: 4 courses in June (NL), Sept (NL), Nov (SI) and (PT)
 - 2015: 4 courses in Jan (SI), Mar (PT), May (SI) and Sept (NL)
- 30 participants per workshop
- Theoretical and practical sessions with exercises on implementing and verifying compliance with EU legislation, panel discussions, field visits on sampling (feed/TSE testing)
