#### **Species and legal purposes**

| Species         | Animal health | Food safety | Meat labelling |  |
|-----------------|---------------|-------------|----------------|--|
| Bovine          | Yes           | Yes         | Yes            |  |
| Ovine & Caprine | Yes           | Yes         | No             |  |
| Porcine         | Yes           | Yes         | No             |  |



#### **Species and some other utilizations**

| Species         | Farm<br>management | Breeding | Meat marketing |  |
|-----------------|--------------------|----------|----------------|--|
| Bovine          | Yes                | Yes      | Yes            |  |
| Ovine & Caprine | Yes                | Yes      | Yes            |  |
| Porcine         | No                 | No       | No             |  |



#### Main activities according to species

| Species         | Holding        | Animal marks |          | Animal traceability |           |
|-----------------|----------------|--------------|----------|---------------------|-----------|
|                 | identification | Animal ID    | Group ID | Individual          | Transport |
| Bovine          | Yes            | Yes          | No       | Yes                 | $(No)^1$  |
| Ovine & Caprine | Yes            | Yes          | Yes      | Yes                 | Yes       |
| Porcine         | Yes            | No           | Yes      | No                  | Yes       |

#### Why a process based approach?

- Master the complexity
- Animal IRT should be considered as an organization which may be divided in several processes
- Each process should be analyzed separately




#### Benefits from a process based approach

- Definition of the expected results and of their users
- Enumeration of all the requirements to be met
- Better understanding of the activities required to deliver the results and of their interactions
- Illustrates the business requirements for the animal IRT information system
- A framework for quality management
- Pave the way to standardized processes similar to those existing in other sectors which may be implemented by standardized software packages




#### IRT according to a process based approach
