




ASF in the EU in **2014-2022**

- **1. Lithuania** (1/2014) only in wild boar for (+1y, last outbreak in pigs: 10/08/2020)
- **2. Poland** (1/2014) + 1 outbreak in pigs (1994 pigs) in Wielkopolskie at the end of May 2022
- **3. Latvia** (6/2014) last outbreak in pigs: 11/08/2021
- **4. Estonia** (7/2015) one outbreak in pigs on 14/07/2021
- **5. Romania** (7/2017) + 161 outbreaks in pigs in 2022 (473 during the same period last year)
- **6. Hungary** (4/2018) only in wild boar
- 7. Bulgaria (6/2018) + 2 outbreaks in backyard pigs in Jan 2022
- **8. Slovakia** (7/2019) + 2 outbreaks in 2022 (168 + 204 pigs)
- **9. Germany** (9/2020) mainly close to PL border, +4 outbreaks in pigs in 2021 (all eradicated); + 1 outbreak (35 pigs) in Baden-Württemberg at the end of May 2022
- **10. Italy** (mainland 1/2022) wild boar + 1 small pig farm (Rome)
- Sardinia, IT unrelated epidemiological situation since 1978

Czechia – 6/2017, <u>free</u> from ASF since 02/2019

Belgium - 9/2018, free from ASF since 11/2020

Greece – 2/2020, one outbreak in pigs (eradicated)

ASF in mainland Italy – 2022: three spots



- 135 cases to date


- Lazio Region Municipality Rieti

- 1 outbreak in pigs 10 June 2022










ASF in mainland Italy – 2022: a new challenge

ASF in Germany: Challenge: free range/organic pigs




Annex 1: Map Germany (blue dot marks ASF case)

- Genotype II variant not related to other German zones


ASF outbreaks in wild boar in 2021-2022 in Germany

- 1 (4038 pigs) in Mecklenburg Western Pomerania (MV) (eradicated)

EU ASF Zoning measures

EU regionalisation

Regulation (EU) 2021/605:

- Restricted zone I ('an additional further restricted zone') – zone, bordering zone II or III, where relevant (no ASF)
- Restricted zone II ('an infected zone') ASF in wild boar
- Restricted zone III ('a further restricted zone', in addition to PZ/SZ) ASF in domestic pigs (with or without ASF in wild boar)
- Predictability: emergency measures > regionalization
- **Transparency:** EU guidelines (*Principles and criteria for geographical regionalisation*) available online:



EU policy development: ASF Regulation






EU legislation: ASF Regulation

Main principles of Regulation (EU) 2021/605 (special ASF control measures)

- Prohibitions in relation to the dispatch of certain commodities out of restricted zones
- Safe derogations from prohibitions under specific conditions and risk mitigation measures
- Special designation of establishments and requirements
- Information and training obligations and public awareness
- Reinforced biosecurity measures
- List of restricted zones categorised by the epidemiological situation (**regionalisation**)



Ongoing work for revision of ASF Regulation

- Advanced ongoing discussion with MSs:
 - within the Commission's Working group of experts (6 meetings from January to May)
 - to be further discussed at the upcoming PAFF Committees
- Main possible amendments to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/605 to address:
 - Prohibitions/derogations for movements of kept porcine animals within restricted zones
 I, II and III;
 - Continuous management of wild porcine in all MSs National action plans (from EU guidelines to EU legislation).

Standing Group of Experts on ASF in Europe (SGE ASF)







- 19 meetings of the SGE ASF in Europe since 2014, recently:
 - May 2020: remote meeting (update on the countries' situation and ASF management in the framework of the Covid-19 crisis)
 - November 2020: remote meeting (update on countries' situation and early reaction and emergency control measures in case of ASF detection in wild boar and domestic pigs)
 - June 2021: remote meeting (update on countries' situation and to present and discuss the exit strategy)
 - 23 November 2021: remote meeting on outdoor pig keeping
 - 23 February 2022: remote meeting to address the newly detected outbreaks in January 2022 in Italy and North Macedonia.
 - Next: in June 2022 (in a hybrid format) on 'the development of ASF vaccines and vaccination strategies'.
- 13 field visits by GF-TADs experts in Belarus, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, the Czech Republic, Romania, Bulgaria, Belgium and Serbia.



- EU legislation: revision -> wildboar management plans

- A need and a challenge of having ASF vaccine: new perspectives

Activities to promote acceptance of EU ASF REGIONALIZATION



Examples (ASF)

Explain principles of EU regionalisation

- Clearly defined roles for Member States and Commission
- Clear criteria and principles
- Rapid flow of information
- Urgent adoption of emergency measures
- Agreed with Member States (regular Committees)
- Immediately applicable
- Decisions published in the Official Journal European Union in 23 languages
- Aligned with international standards (WOAH/OIE)







Awareness raising of EU regionalisation

- Regular regional Standing Group of Experts on ASF in Europe (SGE ASF) and global cooperation on ASF with other regional SGEs (Asia, Americas, Africa)
- GF-TADS

 GLOBAL FRAMEWORK FOR THE PROGRESSIVE CONTROL OF TRANSBOUNDARY ANIMAL DISEASES

 Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations

 WORLD ORGANISATION FOR ANIMAL HEALTH

- 19 meetings since 2014
- Recent international events (EU initiative) dedicated to regionalisation:
 - Thematic session on ASF at WTO SPS Committee (remote, 23 March 2021)
 - A high-level **international conference** 'The future of global pork production under the threat of African swine fever' (85th International **Green Week**, Berlin, 17 January 2020)
- Continuous bilateral meetings and communication with third countries and international organizations (such as OIE, FAO)









State of play

Trade partners examples

A: applying the EU regionalisation policy:

1. USA, Canada, New Zealand, Chile, Russia*

B: partially applying the regionalisation policy

2. Philippines, Singapore, Vietnam

C: Not applying the regionalisation policy

FTA and other agreements (1/4)

The application of the regionalisation principle is included in all FTA negotiations and one of the main items as part of the implementation of the free trade agreements.



FTA and other agreements (2/4)

Japan: Ongoing activities:

- Mutual recognition of animal health project;
- Animal health technical WG (February 2022);
- Focus on main diseases: HPAI (advanced process) and ASF (different pace but done in parallel).

Korea:

- Recently showed some openness to negotiate on regionalization, due to the WTO case flagged.
- Many technical meetings the recent weeks and Korea agreed to finalise the whole procedure, to recognise EU regionalisation measures by end May 2022, at the latest.



FTA and other agreements (3/4)

Central America and Andean countries

Despite the clear provisions recognising the regionalisation principle in the SPS chapters of the respective FTA Agreements, Member States affected by ASF remain blocked to export as their free regions are not recognised.

Colombia

continues to ban imports from Belgium even if ASF is not present anymore in any area of the country. Discussed in the framework of the SPS subcommittee and bilaterally (last July) no significant progress is made, yet. The tone has been elevated and TRADE is studying the case



Bilateral relations

Recognition of EU regionalisation is key and is an important part of the ongoing work at bilateral international level.

China:

- Regionalisation project launched in April 2020 (accepted in principle by China, with some conditions); WGs to be shortly established;
- MoUs to be updated in 2021: Animal health (MARA), food safety (GACC) & (SAMR);
- Several letter on regionalisation-ASF

What else can be done?

- WTO-SPS mechanism;
- Dispute settlement mechanism [WTO DS475: Russia –Pigs];
- Enforcement at EU level;
- More can be done, but in order to be successful activities need to be well planned and coordinated (discussion between real experts).
- Budget is not an issue sue but the availability of good experts is the challenging part.



Future actions... And the vaccine...



Future key actions

- Promote and further fund the research for an ASF vaccine
 - Validate the protective efficacy of the most promising candidate "live attenuated" vaccines (4-5 max. worlwide) in ambitious double blind trial
 - Promote unfinished promising cutting-edge approaches-vaccines which are broader in scope and/or research based on synthetic biology and computational biology
 - Promote cutting-edge approaches (high risk, low success, and high impact research)
- Boost awareness campaigns tackling the so called 'human factor'
 - Reaching different target populations
- High-level Ministerial meeting on African swine fever:
 - wild boar management in the EU in the long-term in the context of ASF
 - fostering research and development of a vaccine against ASF
