LANUZA RESERVOIR NORTHEASTERN PENINSULAR Guide to the

- This trails starts at the entrance of Sallent de Gállego by the A-136 Road, before crossing the river. A few metres ahead, the trail climbs up a slight slope and continues among box and rowan shrubs, until reaching a livestock building, where it turns in the direction of the reservoir.
- This first stretch continues by a path lined with walnut trees until reaching a recreational area which invites the visitor to take a break and calmly take in and enjoy the mountain landscape that surrounds them. Looking back, there is a beautiful view of the Peña Foratata, a 2,341 m mountain whose slopes reach Sallent de Gállego.
- As the reservoir becomes wider, the trail narrows to a path covered by leafy vegetation. The visitor leaves birch trees, hazels, cherry trees, ash trees and willow trees behind as the landscape turns into grazing pastures. From this point the town of Lanuza can be seen at the other side of the reservoir. Every summer, on the third and fourth week of July, this town is host to the Pirineos Sur music festival.
- The trail continues to a second recreational area where, over the Tena valley. again, the walker may take a break and enjoy the views
- Ϋ́Ι The nature trails goes straight to its finishing point, where the walker has two alternative routes back to Sallent. Either they take the same route back to Sallent, or they go back along the reservoir shore and walking calmly through Lanuza, although this extends the route

The Lanuza Reservoir Nature Trails is located in the Tena Valley, in the North of the province of Huesca and in the heart of the Aragon Pyrenees. This simple trail, which stretches over barely 3 km, starts in the town of Sallent de Gállego and leads to the head of the Lanuza Reservoir.






