ter route crosses through different zones, including riparian vegetation, reforestation and a protected holm oak grove. The route starts in the city of Segovia, descends to the floor of Eresma river valley, and continues to the vast floodplains where Hontanares de Eresma is located.

The nature trail runs through several landscapes that create transition zones from the foothills of Sierra de Guadarrama to the fields of cereal in the Douro basin. The eight-kilome-

like the Alcázar, the Cathedral and the Aqueduct. The old quarter of Segovia and its aqueduct were designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985.. The route starts in Altos de la Piedad, an excellent vanta ge point overlooking Segovia and its main monuments

- trail skirts around the motocross circuit along a clearly marked gravel path that leads to the riverbank. a protection fence runs along a steep embankment to the right of the path that is increasingly populated by conifers. Further on, an opening in the fence allows the route to descend through the trees, with interesting views of the ravine and the city of Segovia on one side, and on the other, the Cathedral and the Alcázar. Back on the trail, the route arrives at Mirador del Alcázar, with sweeping views of Eresma and Clamores valleys, the historic Las Lastrillas city centre of Segovia and the area of Zamarramala and In a rest area opposite Segovia's hospital complex, is a stone cross and information panels on the route. The
- Without crossing the river, the road runs along the left bank, among cliffs and a typical gallery forest. After crossing the river Eresma, this part of the route runs parallel to the road where vehicles pass. On arriving at La Pilarcita steep stone staircase leading to Eresma, where another sign next to the San Lázaro Bridge, near the river Eresma, indicates the distances to various points of interest. From Mirador del Alcázar, the route continues down rest area, next to the namesake chapel, the route crosses

the road, past an industrial estate, and turns onto a coun-

Although the nature trail ends at the rest area, just a few meters away are the remains of the old railway station, of which only the railway stop still stands, and hidden in the vegetation is the changeover point.

- an information panel indicates that to complete the nature trail, it is necessary to take the route along a rough dirt pine stand and several poplar groves that grow in places close to the river Eresma or on a rocky outcrop.
