ATXURIAGA TO GALLARTA NORTHEASTERN PENINSULAR

- This route departs from the town of Galdames, going past the industrial estate of "La Aceña", at the old station next to the Villegas tunnel. In its first stretch, the route runs among oaks, hazels and willows through a gravel track, which crosses the Malpeña tunnel after 700 metres and continues towards a eucalyptus area
- The route continues straight on, going back to the gravel track among pines, oaks, hazels and willows, leaving The path continues along this track for a few more metres until it reaches some houses, where there is an intersection with route GR-281. After turning right, the route joins the paved road and follows it by turning right again, then reaching a new intersection.


- 4 After travelling a couple of kilometres among pines and eucalypti, and a few metres before the path becomes a concrete road, a small drinking fountain is found to the right, from where the route continues until reaching the paved road towards Muskiz.
- Ϋ́Ι After going past a grill house and continuing straight under eucalypti, the path crosses the road through a pa unuer eucalypti, the path crosses the road through a paved track and, after one kilometre, it reaches the Sobaco tunnel, in whose exit there is a drinking fountain. The route, indicated in red until the end of the nature trail, reaches a recreational area among black locusts and pines, crosses another tunnel and continues towards the main road, where it goes on through the hard shoulder.
