VILLACANAS TO QUINTANAR DE LA ORDEN

- The trail begins on the eastern side of Villacañas, clo se to the municipality's train station, where there is an information panel showing the route and the main features on the route of this nature trail, which runs parallel to the CM-410, connecting this area with the municipality of Quintanar.
- crossing the CM-3001 bypass, heading east, there are a number of industrial units that mark the end of the town. The trail crosses the Quijote Route which runs to the Laguna Larga and forms part of the Mancha Húmeda Special Protection Area (SPA) for Birds. Returning to the trail, the landscape is typical of La Mancha, with endless flatlands dotted with olive trees and vineyards to accompany the traveller along their way.
- 'n After crossing the Riansares River, there is a path that leads to one of the many hermitages of La Mancha; the Hermitage of San Gregario, a fine example of the religious passion of local inhabitants.
- 4 As it crosses road CM-3005, the trail leads us to Villa de Don Fadrique, crowned by the chimneys of its old distilleries and where we can either take a walk through the town centre or enjoy the landscape and fauna of the Laguna del Rey, north of the town itself and listed among the natural spaces that comprise the "Mancha" Húmeda" SPA

In the heart of La Mancha, in the province of Toledo, a railway was built in the early 20th century connecting

area, opening the way for wine production which continues to prosper today and which has contributed greatly to the socio-economic growth of the area. Although the railway line is much longer, at this moment a stretch totalling 26 kilometres has been converted into a nature trail.
